- 6) **Shampoo Planet** - **Douglas Coupland** The follow-up to the better

- 7) **How To Watch Soccer - Ruud Gullit** "An opinionated masterclass in the art and science of "reading" a match from one of professional soccer's most respected and beloved international figure."
- 8) **Riddley Walker**—**Russell Hoban** 2000 years after nuclear war has devastated world civilizations, Riddley stumbles upon efforts to recreate a weapon of the ancient world.

## "Dean Martin" Coming To LB2 for 100th Birthday

Dean Martin was born Dino Paul Crocetti in Steubenville, Ohio on June 7, 1917—one hundred years ago this month.

Known for his adventures with The Rat Pack and his early comedy partnership with Jerry Lewis, his unique singing style has reinforced his status as king of cool. Even Elvis Presley said: "He was the coolest dude I'd

ever seen - period."

In a tribute to Martin, who died on Christmas Day 1995, singer Dave DeLuca will recreate the experience of seeing Martin in concert on his visit to LB2.

In his one-man show "That's Amore: A Century Of Dean Martin" Dave DeLuca imitates Martin's relaxed, warbling

crooning voice as he performs signature songs such as Memories Are Made of This, Everybody Loves Somebody, You're Nobody till Somebody Loves You, Volare, Ain't That a Kick in the Head, and That's Amore.
