From The Director's Desk...

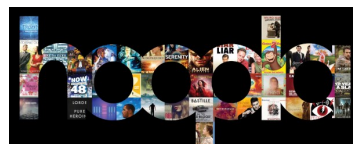
For those patrons who have used and enjoyed Hoopla – the digital collection of over 200,000 streaming and downloadable movies, TV shows, music, and audiobooks that you can access on your computer or download to a portable device – I regret that I have some disappointing news.

It was so wildly popular across BCCLS that the cost for the service has skyrocketed and become unsustainable for the consortium's budget.

For the month of September, per patron checkouts are reduced to 4 and as of October 1, the service will be discontinued entirely.

CloudLibrary, Naxos, and Zinio continue to provide access to other digital media and the Reference Desk will be happy to help you get started and navigate these services.

"Fiction Addiction" and "Adults Who Read YA."

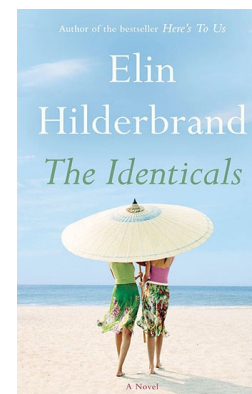
If you see her around at LB2 don't forget to say hi and to ask her to recommend something good to read!

Staff Picks For September

New Adult Services librarian and book club coordinator Jessica shares some of her favorite books.

Everything Everything by Nicola Yoon -- A YA love story that has recently been made into a movie. This novel follows the story of Maddy, an 18 year old girl who has lived her entire life in a "sanitary confinement" within her own home because she is believed to have Severe Combined Immunodeficiency (SCID). This novel causes one to question what it means to love as well as what it means to truly live.

The Identicals by Elin Hilderbrand - Hilderbrand's



latest novel is about two twin sisters who grew up to live separate lives after their parent's divorce. Think Lindsay Lohan in Parent Trap. What is interesting is that the twins actually live on the twin islands of Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket. The comparisons between the two sisters and the two sister islands gives the novel a unique quality that I haven't seen in her other work.

Secrets in Summer by Nancy Thayer -- Nancy Thayer and Elin Hilderbrand. The queens of the Nantucket beach read, how can one go wrong? This is Thayer's latest novel and by far my favorite one by her. Maybe

it's because I felt like I was reading about my life - or rather what could be my life. (The main character is a librarian!) This novel is the perfect weekend read for any season.

Lilac Girls by Martha Hall Kelly -- Probably one of my favorite takes on WWII historical fiction. Lilac Girls is Kelly's debut novel which is told from the perspectives of three women during Hitler's invasion of Poland. Kelly put a lot of historical research into this novel which is described in the back appendix. The good news? Kelly is currently working on another book!
